Miguel de San Juan was born in El Paso del Norte of unknown parents. He is the ancestor of many New Mexicans. On 28 April 1710, Miguel de San Juan's intention to wed was reviewed by church authorities. This marriage intention investigation, or "diligencia," was taken in Bernalillo and is found in NEW MEXICO ROOTS, LTD., by Fray Angelico Chavez, Vol. IX, p. 1775, #9. The "diligencia" was intended to prevent bigamies and marriages of closely related couples. In 1710 Miguel de San Juan was 17 or 18 years old, born in 1692 or 1693.

The bride of Miguel de San Juan was Isabel Montoya, daughter of Capt. Diego Montoya and Josefa de Hinojos. Those giving information about the couple were: Jose de Quintana, Notary; Capt. Juan Gonzales-Bas (40); Joseph Lopez (60); and Ignacio Aragon (50); all of Bernalillo. The couple were married on 5 May 1710, and the "padrinos" or godparents who were personal attendants at the ceremony were Manuel Baca and Josefa Baca.

In Spanish parish registers there are often missing sections, and the only recourse for tracing ancestry is through the "padrinos" who are found on all baptisms and many marriages. The "padrinos" are generally either blood relatives or in-laws.

The ancestry of Miguel de San Juan has been a most intriguing mystery. His children used the names San Juan, Montoya, Luna, Alvares de Luna, and Muniz de Luna. The only child specifically recorded as belonging to Miguel de San Juan and Isabel Montoya is their daughter, Margarita de Luna. Margarita is found in the "diligencia" of her proposed marriage to Esteban Duran, 17. The bride is 15. The date was 17 January 1727. It is located in NEW MEXICO ROOTS, LTD., by Fray Angelico Chavez, Vol. III. p. 447. Margarita de Luna is shown as the widow of Duran in the will of her second husband, Pedro Martin Serrano, 1768, Corral de Piedra, Santa Clara. In this record, Miguel de San Juan, father of the bride, holds the military title of "Alferez." The will of Pedro Martin Serrano is located in Piedre Lumbre Grant, Surveyor General Records, Private Land Claims, Report 30, File 33, Frames 68 to 76.

The other children are ascertained by the use of their many surnames and appearances as padrinos. Joachin de Luna is a padrino with Isabel Montoya. Widows appeared as padrinos only with their sons. The relationships between couples and padrinos are shown in records later in this article.

Miguel de San Juan is a notary in a "diligencia" taken on 28 November 1720 in Albuquerque, where he is referred to as "Notary at Isleta." See NEW MEXICO ROOTS, LTD., By Fray Angelico Chavez, Vol. IV, p. 594. Being a notary would indicate Miguel de San Juan could read and write. Education in those times was costly and limited to people of means.

While reading an English translation of THE SPANISH ARCHIVES OF NEW MEXICO, Vol. I, Archive No. 1343, located in the New Mexico State Archives, a most interesting fact appeared. This document dealt with a lawsuit between Santo Domingo and Cochiti Pueblos over lands sold to Cochiti by Juana Baca. It took place on 8 June 1722 at Santo Domingo Pueblo. The Lieutenant General, Rael de Aguilar, "Called in Miguel de San Juan, a son of Juana Baca, so he may declare the lands which his mother sold, their limits and boundaries."

"Miguel de San Juan appeared before Aguilar being fully apprised of the above he declared that the land which his mother sold to the Indians of Cochiti are on the other side of the Rio del Norte," and the lands in litigation and which the Santo Domingo Indians claim to have a right to are not included with the lands she sold to Cochiti. Miguel de San Juan states that the title of the grant she sold is now in possession of the Indians of Cochiti. The suit was settled to the satisfaction of both parties.

In early Bernalillo records it shows Miguel de San Juan as a "padrino" with Juana Baca on 12 May 1704, 30 October 1705, and 10 February 1708. On 5 May 1710, in Bernalillo, Miguel de San Juan was married, with "padrinos" Manuel Baca and Josefa Baca in attendance.

Two women named Juana Baca lived at this time. Fray Chavez placed one as the daughter of Manuel Baca and Maria de Salazar. The other Juana was the daughter of Jose Baca and Josefa Pacheco. This Jose Baca was killed in El Paso and was the brother of the above Manuel Baca.

After much study and evaluation, the Juana Baca who was the daughter of Jose Baca has been eliminated as the mother of Miguel de San Juan. Her records are shown in an appendix to this article.

Thanks to Mr. Jonathan Ortega of Albuquerque, who brought to my attention further land grant data establishing which Juana Baca was the mother of Miguel de San Juan. Her recorded background was greatly expanded by this material. Mr. Ortega located the material in the vast reference work, FOUNDERS OF ALBUQUERQUE, which was compiled by Mr. Donald Dreeson of Albuquerque and is located in the Special Collections Branch of the Albuquerque Public Library at 423 Central Avenue NE.

Before going into this new land grant data, we must first examine the other available sources relating to this Juana Baca. This material will be divided into four parts:

- A. Juana Baca; Her Real Parents; Her Daughters.
- B. The Chavez Connection.
- C. The Erroneous Tie to Francisco Xavier.
- D. The Luna Connection.

A. Juana Baca; Her Real Parents; Her Daughters.

Juana Baca and Her Real Parents:

In the 1692 Census of Guadalupe del Paso (reproduced in Mid-America Magazine, Vol. 23, January 1941, translated by J. Manuel Espinosa, copy of which is located at UNM Special Collections, Zimmerman Library, Albuquerque) we find Manuel Baca, supposed father of Juana Baca, listed in the sub-locality, Real de San Lorenzo as follows:

Real de San Lorenzo:

Manuel Baca, married to Maria de Salazar, with 3 sons and 3 daughters:

Antonio 9 years	Maria 13 years*
Diego 1 year	Josepha 7 years
Gregorio 3 years	Bernardina 5 years

Manuel is ready to resettle in New Mexico if given help.

*This Maria is Maria Magdalena (the first) who is referred to on p. 141 of ORIGINS OF NEW MEXICO FAMILIES by Fray Angelico Chavez.

In the 1697 Census of Santa Fe (Archivo General de Indias, Guadalajara Legato 141, Document #20, copy located in the Special Collections Branch of the Albuquerque Public Library, 423 Central Avenue NE) under the heading, "Families From Zacatecas and Sombrerete," p. 57, #184:

Manuel Baca, his wife Maria, his children:
Antonio, Gregorio, Diego*, Manuel*, Juan*,
Josepha, Bernarda.

*Diego and Manuel are one person, and Juan is Manuel's son Juan Antonio Baca. See ORIGINS OF NEW MEXICO FAMILIES by Fray Angelico Chavez, p. 141.

At #185 and next door:

Joseph Vasquez and his wife, Maria.

(See Maria Baca--Maria Magdalena above.)

There is no Juana in the household of Manuel Baca in either 1692 or 1697. Captain Manuel Baca's mother, Dona Ana Moreno de Lara, is found in the 1692 Census of Guadalupe del Paso (See previous reference for source.) p. 81, Ysleta. This is located in present Texas, settled by Indians fleeing from Isleta in New Mexico during the Pueblo Indian Revolt.

Dona Ana Moreno de Lara, married to Cristoval Baca, 5 years absent from these parts, now residing in Pasaxe with two daughters who live with him, Juana, 18, and Luisa, 17.

Also, Dona Ana has two sons absent. Francisco, married, lives at the mines of Cusiguriache. The other, Pedro Vaca, also married, lives in the Real of Parral.

In Dona Ana's house are two orphans, Pedro, age 5, and Elena, age 12, and Dona Ana's granddaughter, Josepha, age 5.

Further details of Juana Baca appear in Donald Dreesen's research. It must be noted here that the following land grant reel and frame numbers are that of the "Old University of New Mexico Series." In the last four years, they have been totally renumbered by J. Richard Salazar, Chief of Archival Services at New Mexico State Records Center and Archives in Santa Fe. Mr. Salazar also compiled the catalog for the new system. The "old" series used here were located at the Special Collections Branch of the Albuquerque Public Library in March of 1991. Again, thanks to Mr. Jonathan Ortega for securing copies of critical land grant pages for this compiler.

In the El Ranchito Land Grant, Reel 49, Case 157, Frame 613 (old series) 23 August 1713, Capt. Manuel Baca of Albuquerque gives his part of certain land to his sister, Dona Juana Baca, in San Francisco de Bernalillo, called San Antonio de la Angostura, which Manuel Baca and Juana Baca bought from Capt. Don Fernando Duran y Chaves. Juana Baca is referred to as sister of Manuel Baca at least three times on this frame. Manuel says he is giving her this land, "upon account of the great esteem and affection I have for her and for the many kindnesses and benefits I owe her."

Frame 633 (old series) states Manuel and Juana Baca bought the land from Chavez in 1706, and, on this page, Juana is called his sister once again.

The Juana Baca Land Grant is also called the Pueblo de Cochiti Grant (Sur. Gen. Records, Court of Private Land Claims, Reel 50, Case 172, Frame 218). Cochiti Pueblo sought confirmation of a grant made by Pedro Rodriguez Cubero, Governor and Captain General of New Mexico, to Juana Baca, which she sold to Cochiti, and confirmation of a grant made on 16 July 1766 to the Pueblo of Cochiti. They wished to establish that these grants were made at different times to different people and should be considered separately.

The Juana Baca petition lacked dates or boundaries and no proof of the grant was in force when New Mexico became U.S. territory, so a decree of confirmation could not be given.

Juana Baca and Her Daughters:

Juana Baca is called the daughter of Manuel Baca and Maria de Salazar by Fray Angelico Chavez in ORIGINS OF NEW MEXICO FAMILIES, p. 144. Juana is shown with two daughters, Juana the younger, married to Francisco Duran y Chaves, and Antonia, who was the second wife of Antonio Duran y Chaves, brother of the above Francisco.

Fray Chavez states that, "Relationships of mother and daughters are deduced from Chavez family charts.³⁵" In Note 35 on page 145 of the above source, the sources listed are as follows:

1. Spanish Archives of N.M., Vol II, #437.
2. Marriage Investigation of Jose Baca and Juana Chaves, 1766.
3. Marriage Investigation of Juan Antonio Baca and Barbara Montoya, 1735.
(This was actually 1770.)

We will examine these one at a time.

1. Spanish Archives of N.M., Vol II, #437:

22 January 1741

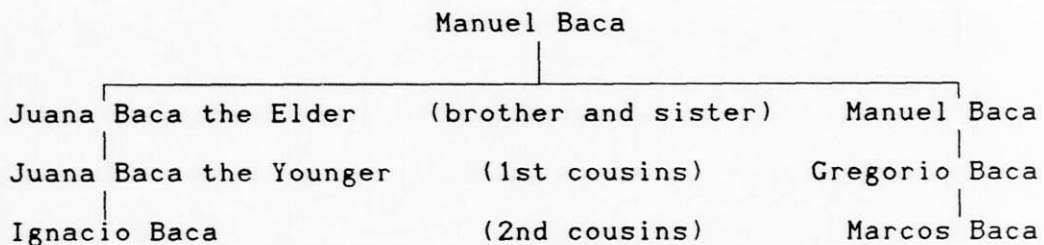
Trial of Juan Marquez and Francisco Xavier (also called Francisco Xavier Anaya) for the murder of Magdalena Baca, wife of Juan Marquez. The men served two years in prison and were then exiled. Marquez was sent to the Pueblo of San Augustin de la Isleta and Xavier to the Pueblo Nuevo de Nuestra Senora de la Concepcion in the Puesto called Thome Dominguez.

The archive was 47 pages long, and line by line, no mention was made of Juana Baca. The deceased Magdalena's brother, Jose Baca, is found there and Josefa Baca, no relationship stated, requested the return of an item loaned to the deceased. Perhaps this record belonged to another reference and was misplaced.

2. NEW MEXICO ROOTS, LTD. by Fray Angelico Chavez, Vol. I, p. 159. Marriage Investigation:

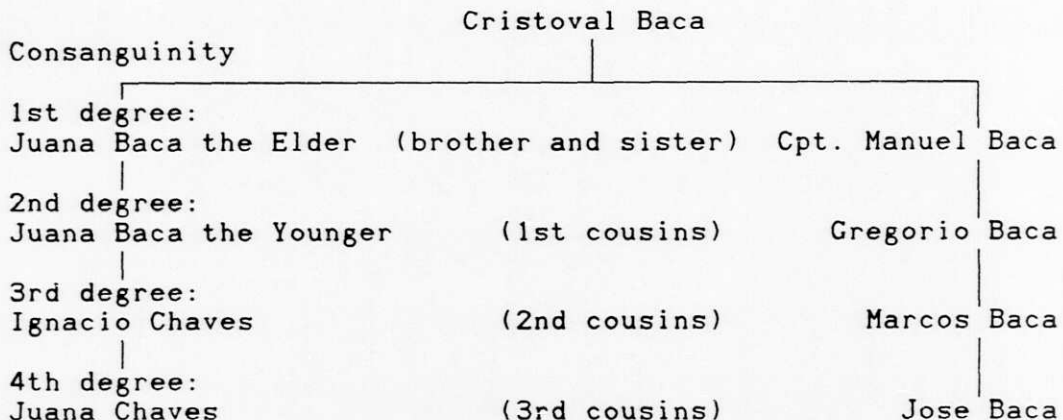
15 September 1766. #15, Albuquerque

"Jose Baca. (25). Spaniard of N.S. del Rio Puerco, son of Capt. Marcos Baca and Maria Jaramillo, and Juana Chaves. (14), of Atrisco, daughter of Ignacio Baca and Gregoria Maese. Pair related, closed 4th degree consanguinity as follows:" (The graph is shown exactly as it appears in the book, but there are some discrepancies to be discussed after this graph appears.)



Witnesses: Pedro Jose Pino, Notary; Felipe Silva (60), of Tome; Don Isidro Sanchez Banares de Tagle (66) of Alameda; Francisco Silva. (The witnesses gave the information. The Silvas were relatives of the groom's mother.)

The graph should read in this manner:



Capt. Manuel Baca was married to Maria de Salazar (See ORIGINS OF NEW MEXICO FAMILIES by Fray Angelico Chavez, p. 141). He was the son of Cristoval Baca and Ana Morena de Lara. Manuel and Maria are found in a 1692 Census with a son Gregorio Baca, age 3 (p. 4 of this work).

Records of Gregorio Baca in Bernalillo Roman Catholic Parish Register, show he was a "padrino" in 1707 and 1709 when he appeared with his mother, Maria de Salazar. Gregorio Baca married Ignacia Romero in 1712. (The record is crossed out, but a note says the marriage would be recorded in the new book, which is now lost.)

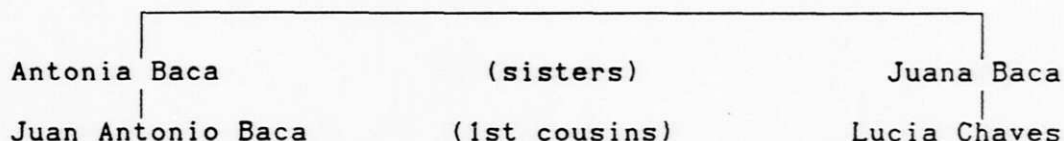
Marcos Baca married Maria Jaramillo/Silva in 1734 at San Felipe de Neri, Albuquerque. His age was 48 when he witnessed a marriage investigation of 1766, so he was born about 1718.

The dates provided for those on the preceding graphs should establish the true identities of the principal people and place them in the proper time frames.

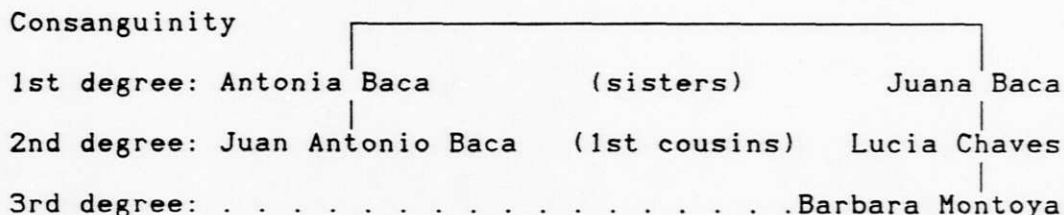
3. NEW MEXICO ROOTS, LTD., by Fray Angelico Chavez, Vol. I, p. 161:

10 August 1770, #3 Albuquerque
(Reference note said 1735.)

"Juan Antonio Baca (32), son of Dona Antonia Baca (only), and Dona Barbara Montoya. Pair related 2nd and 3rd degree consanguinity."



The expanded graph would be as follows:



None of the three sources shown for Juana Baca and her daughters give any proof as to the placement of Juana as a daughter of Manuel Baca and Maria de Salazar.

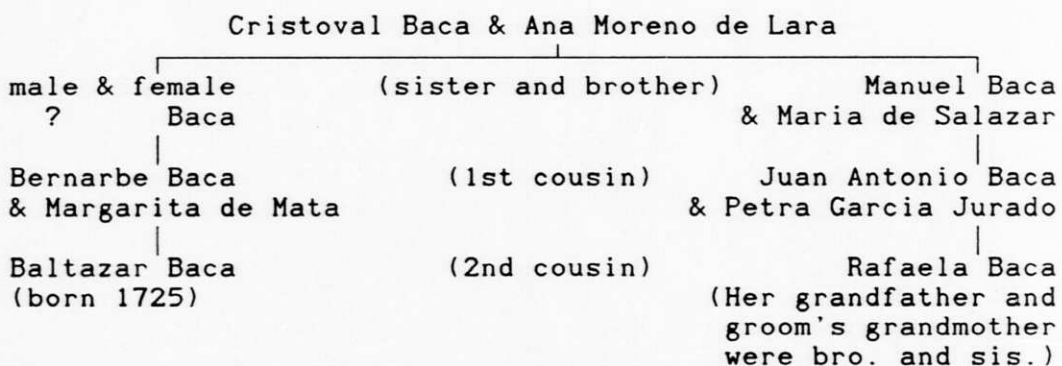
Another marriage investigation was brought to my attention by Mr. Jonathan Ortega. This also deals with Juana Baca or her sister Luisa Baca. NEW MEXICO ROOTS, LTD. by Fray Angelico Chavez, Vol. I, p. 158:

1762, Isleta, #5.

"Baltazar Baca (37) of San Clemente, widowed of Dona Manuela Rael de Aguilar, buried in Isleta Church, son of Capt. Bernabe Baca and Dona Margarita Mata, both deceased, and Dona Rafaela Baca (39) of San Clemente, widow of Capt. Diego de Torres, buried in Isleta Church, daughter of Don Juan Baca and Dona Petra Garcia Jurado, both deceased Dispensed from 3rd degree consanguinity, reason being the paucity of equal status in the Kingdom: Groom's grandmother and bride's grandfather were brother and sister."

Witnesses: Mateo Jose Pino, Notary; Don Isidro Sanchez de Tagle (62); Capt. Don Felipe Silva (57); both of Tome and Sr. Francisco Silva (60).

The only possible development of this relationship is through the Baca ancestry as shown on the following graph:

"Don Bernabe Baca (60), of San Clemente, widowed of Dona Teresa Gutierrez, and Maria Josefa Sedillo (18), Spanish, daughter of Capt. Antonio Sedillo and Gregoria Gonzales Bas. Witnesses: Felipe Jacobo Romero, Notary; Marcial Rael (51); Martin Montoya (40)."

Apparently a third marriage for Bernabe Baca:

Albuquerque Marriages, 9 December 1760
"Don Bernabe Baca and Josefa Sedillo."
Witnesses: Domingo de Luna and Josefa Lucero.

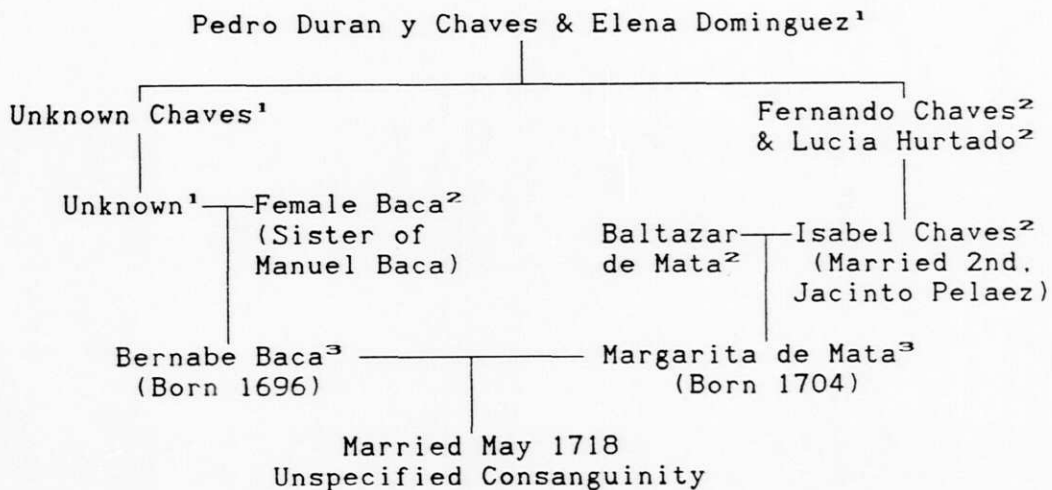
(Domingo de Luna is a son of Antonio de Luna.)

May 1718. #9. Albuquerque

"Bernabe Baca (22) and Dona Margarita de Mata (14), dispensed from unspecified degree of consanguinity. Witnesses: Jose de Quintana, Notary (Bernalillo); Juan de Dios Martin, Notary of Albuquerque; Juan Griego (34); Nicolas Lucero. (incomplete)."

B. The Chaves Connection.

The marriage of Antonia Baca, daughter of Juana Baca, is found in NEW MEXICO ROOTS, LTD., by Fray Angelico Chavez, Vol. II, p. 305. The marriage took place 23 March 1718. Antonia was 15 years old and of unknown parentage. The groom was Antonio Duran y Chaves, widower of Maria Magdalena Montano, and son of Don Fernando Duran y Chaves and Dona Lucia Hurtado. The bride would have been born in 1703. Bride and groom were of 3rd degree consanguinity.

Dona Juana Baca, of unknown parentage, married Francisco Duran y Chaves, son of Don Fernando Duran y Chaves and Dona Lucia Hurtado. The marriage investigation took place 26 April 1713 when the bride was 14 and the groom 20 plus. The bride was born in 1699 and was related to the groom by 3rd degree consanguinity. (Source as above.)

Antonia Baca and her sister, Juana Baca the younger, both of unknown parentage and each related to their grooms by 3rd degree consanguinity, present a challenging puzzle. Being second cousins, they share a common great-grandparent. Between the daughter of Juana Baca and the sons of Don Fernando Duran y Chaves and Lucia Hurtado, all the lines in their ancestries (Ortiz, Baca, Moreno de Lara, Hurtado, and Dominguez Mendoza*) fall short of the goal of a common great-grandfather except for Chaves, and this would demand a Chaves father for the daughters of Juana Baca. (*To be explained later.)

Probing this situation required careful charting of the early Chavez family shown in ORIGINS OF NEW MEXICO FAMILIES, pp. 19, 20, 21, 22; and CHAVEZ, A DISTINCTIVE NEW MEXICO CLAN, both by Fray Angelico Chavez.

Thanks to Mr. Gerald Mandell of Albuquerque who located and shared a very interesting page in the microfilm of The Atrisco Land Grant Hearing (U.S. Surveyor General Records, Court of Private Land Claims, Reel 37, Case 45, Frames 727 and 728, new series):

28 October 1692, at Mejia to Governor and General Diego de Vargas Zapata Luhan Ponce de Leon. Don Fernando de Chaves requests, "...the other tract is also on the Rio Grande, commonly called Atrisco, also of agricultural land with its acequia madre (mother ditch) and this one in from the bluff where there is an old house in which Juan de Perea lived going down the riverside as far as some corrals which Colonel Juan Dominguez, my brother-in-law, had and on said tract my father, Don Pedro Duran y Chavez, lived and also some other persons by permission." (Gerald Mandell, Research Consultant, Vargas Project, UNM, states that the Vargas Journal confirms Vargas was at Mejia in 1692.)

The above record was a certified copy of the original. This was stated on the first page of the Atrisco Land Grant Hearing. The original source for the document was Book "C" of the U.S. Surveyor General Records of New Mexico. This book is in the State Records Center and Archives, Santa Fe, New Mexico. Mr. J. Richard Salazar, Chief of Archival Services, kindly located the pages needed, pages 34B, 35, and 35B. The original record was apparently an exact copy of a document brought into court and actually written in 1692. This series appears to contain court copies of all ancient documents presented at court.

The record of 1692, a petition made by the only known Chavez to return to New Mexico, contradicts the Chavez lineage established by Fray Chavez. It also identifies the parents of the Chavez wife of Juan Dominguez Mendoza.

In CHAVEZ, A DISTINCTIVE NEW MEXICO CLAN, pp. 21, 37, and 42, Fray Chavez has now placed Augustin as a son of the first Pedro Duran y Chaves rather than as a son of the first Fernando Duran y Chaves. Fray Chavez has also placed Cristoval Chaves as the first born son of the first Fernando and the second Fernando as Fernando's second son, a reversal of his original lineage plan. Adjusting the data from the works of Fray Chavez and the document of 1692 will be attempted in order to establish a framework showing the relationships between the daughters of Juana Baca and the sons of Fernando Chavez and Lucia Hurtado.

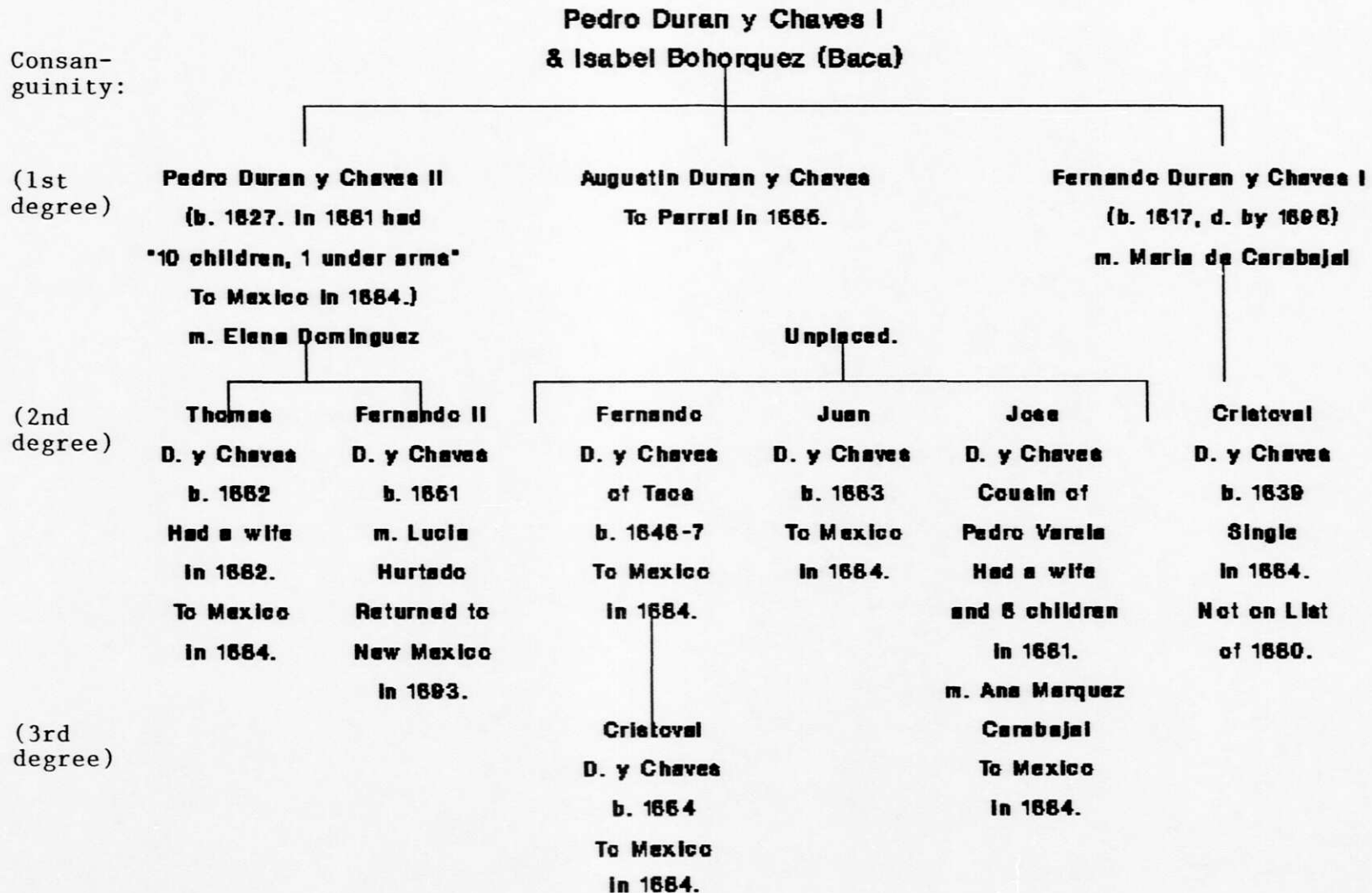

C. The Erroneous Tie to Francisco Xavier.

The problems involving Juana Baca seem to increase with each new finding. In ORIGINS OF NEW MEXICO FAMILIES by Fray Angelico Chavez, on page 10, he states that Juana, daughter of Cristoval Baca and Ana Moreno de Lara became the wife of Francisco Xavier II. Juana was counted in the Baca household of 1687 living with her mother, and Cristoval Baca was not present. In 1692, Juana Baca was 18 and living with her father in Pasaxe (near Cuencame) while her mother was in Ysleta (del Paso).

Under Xavier, on p. 113, Fray Chavez states that, in 1680, Francisco Xavier II "...was a widower with a child of three or four years...." "In departing for New Spain (Mexico), he left his child with relatives who brought her back to New Mexico with the Reconquest. She was the Josefa Xavier, orphan and poor, who married Luis Garcia in Bernalillo in August 1704. Her mother was Juana Francisca Baca; her father at this date was stationed at the Presidio del Gallo in Nueva Vizcaya."

NEW MEXICO ROOTS, LTD., by Fray Angleico Chavez, Vol. IV, p. 591:

"8 August 1704, #4, Bernalillo

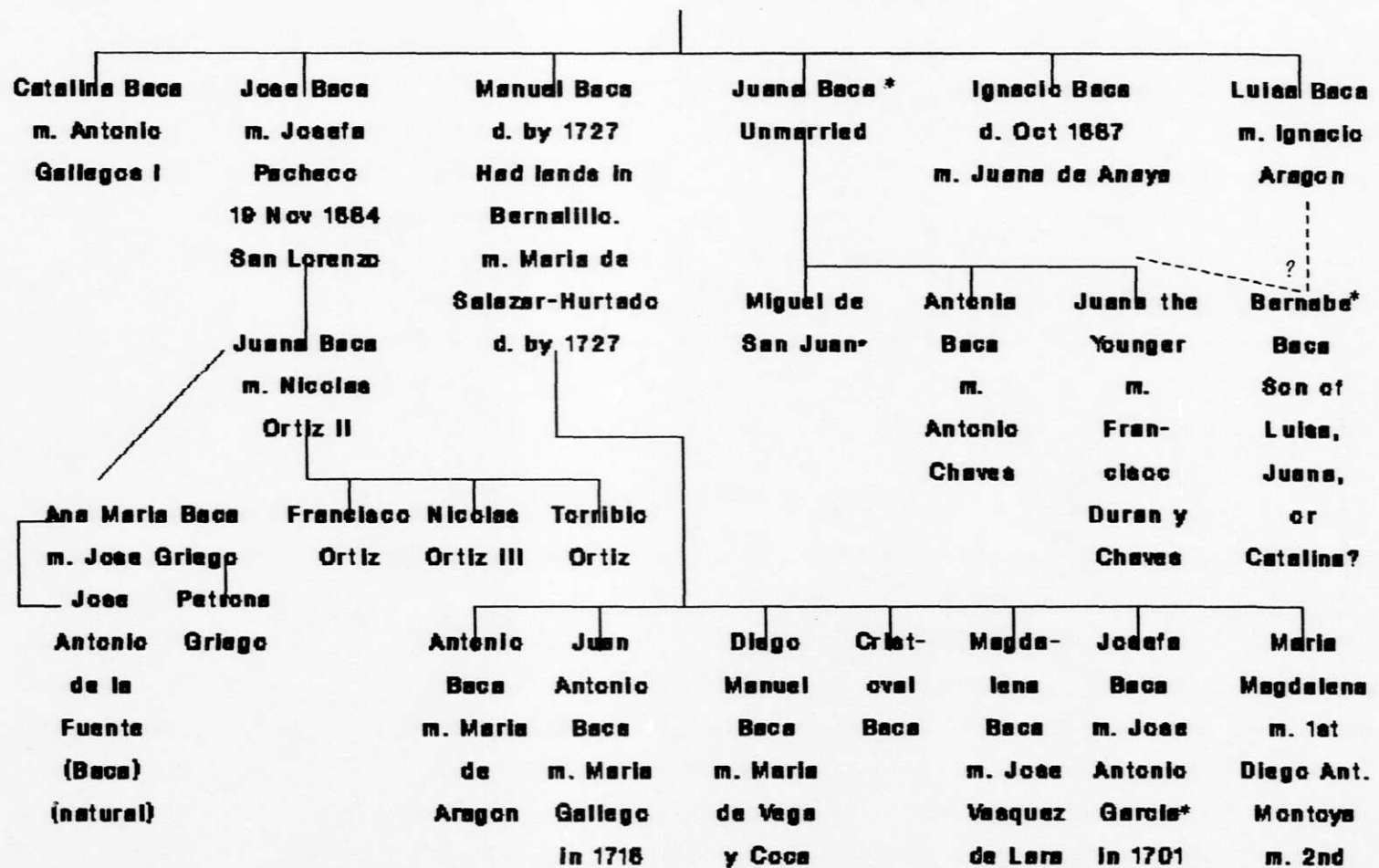
Luis Garcia, 20, soldier of the Santa Fe Presidio, son of Sargento Mayor Alonso Garcia and Dona Ana de Vera Jorge, both deceased, and Josefa Xavier, now living in Bernalillo, daughter of Francisco Xavier and Dona Francisca Baca of New Mexico origin, now living at the Presidio del Gallo, Nueva Viscaya...." The groom states he is related to the bride. (There is no indication that the bride's mother is dead on this record.)

Fray Chavez states on p. 181 of ORIGINS OF NEW MEXICO FAMILIES that "Luis Garcia de Noriega married Josefa Xavier y Baca, reared in the Valverde family...." Josefa Xavier died on 20 January 1735. In the will of Luis Garcia of 1737, he names his first wife as Josefa "Velarde."

Francisco Xavier had a three or four year old child in 1680 and was a widower. This child would have been born around 1677-1678. How do we reconcile the fact that in 1680, Juana Baca, daughter of Cristoval Baca and Ana Moreno de Lara, was six years old and could not possibly be the "Francisca Baca" of the marriage investigation of 1704 and the mother of Josefa Xavier. Further, Josefa Xavier, raised by Valverdes, was returned to New Mexico with the Reconquest of 1693. In 1692, Juana Baca, daughter of Cristoval Baca, was living with her father in Pasaxe and neither a living or dead mother of Josefa Xavier or wife of Francisco Xavier. Juana Baca, daughter of Cristoval Baca, was not the Francisca Baca who married Francisco Xavier.

Capt. Francisco Xavier and his wife, Dona Francisca Baca, were witnesses on 16 August 1684 at Real de San Lorenzo to the marriage of Jose Baca and Josefa Perez Pacheco. See NEW MEXICO ROOTS, LTD., by Fray Angelico Chavez, Vol. I, p. 155. Juana Baca, daughter of Cristoval Baca, was 10 years old that year.

D. The Luna Connection.

The following extremely important material appeared in the research of Mr. Donald Dreeson regarding Juana Baca and was brought to the compiler's attention by Mr. Jonathan Ortega.

Town of Atrisco Land Grant, Reel 37, Case 45, Frame 758 (old UNM series):

"At this Hacienda of Sto. Thomas de Villanueva, on 25 April 1732, before me, Capt. Juan Gonzales Bas, Alcalde Mayor and War Captain of the town of San Phelipe de Albuquerque, and its jurisdiction, acting as Judge Commissioner with two witnesses of my attendance for the lack of a royal or public notary for there are none in the kingdom, appeared Dona Ysabel Montoya, widow of the standard bearer Miguel de San Juan, and Dona Josefa Baca, widow of Juan Antonio Garcia* whom I certify I know, and said Dona Ysabel Montoya stated, to wit: that she gave and did give by royal sale to the said Dona Josefa Baca a suerta of land that she has which she obtained as a gift from his mother, Dona Juana Baca, and her brother Antonio de Luna, for the three of them had bought the same from Capt. Juan Fernandez for the sum of \$400.00 in silver and gold in order to make use of the sale partition, has been made between the parties there accruing to each one of them their portion of 2025 varas each, and the said Ysabel sells her portion which said varas are measured and marked out and marked with monuments to the satisfaction of the parties and the said party sells for the sum of \$300.00.... The said party renounces (any claim to the land) and declares that because she is poor and without anything to support her children and thus she conveys and transfers (the land) as has been stated: To wit: (Frame 359) that these \$300.00 received in goods of the country according to their market value.... Cows at \$20.00, the oxen at \$25.00, the sheeps at \$2.00, a pattern of serge with trimmings for \$30.00, a lock of \$6.00, etc..... All to her satisfaction...and there was present her son-in-law, Juan de Chaves** and she has consent of her heirs to sell." Witnesses were Joseph de Quintana and Geronimo Jaramillo. Juan de Chaves signed for Ysabel Montoya as she did not know how to write.

The Atrisco Land Grant tells us that Juana Baca was not only the mother of Miguel de San Juan but was also the sister of Antonio de Luna.

*See appendix.

**Near the end of this article is a marriage investigation and marriage for Juan de Chaves and Rosa de San Juan/de Luna. The above establishes the certain identity of Rosa.)

In the 1692 Census of Guadalupe del Paso, p. 79, in Ysleta (del Paso), an Antonio de Luna, age 15, is found in the home of Capt. Diego de Luna. However, his mother, Elvira Garcia, is named. The credentials of this Antonio de Luna are in order, but he may be considered later as a possible father of Miguel de San Juan. Ana Moreno de Lara, mother of Juana Baca also lived in Ysleta (del Paso).

A second Antonio de Luna was 20 in 1718 when a "diligencia" was taken over his proposed marriage to Jacinta Pelaez, age 14. This Antonio de Luna was born around 1698 and was of "unknown parents." This was a delicate way of stating he was illegitimate, and the parents were certainly known. This Antonio de Luna is the "brother" of Juana Baca.

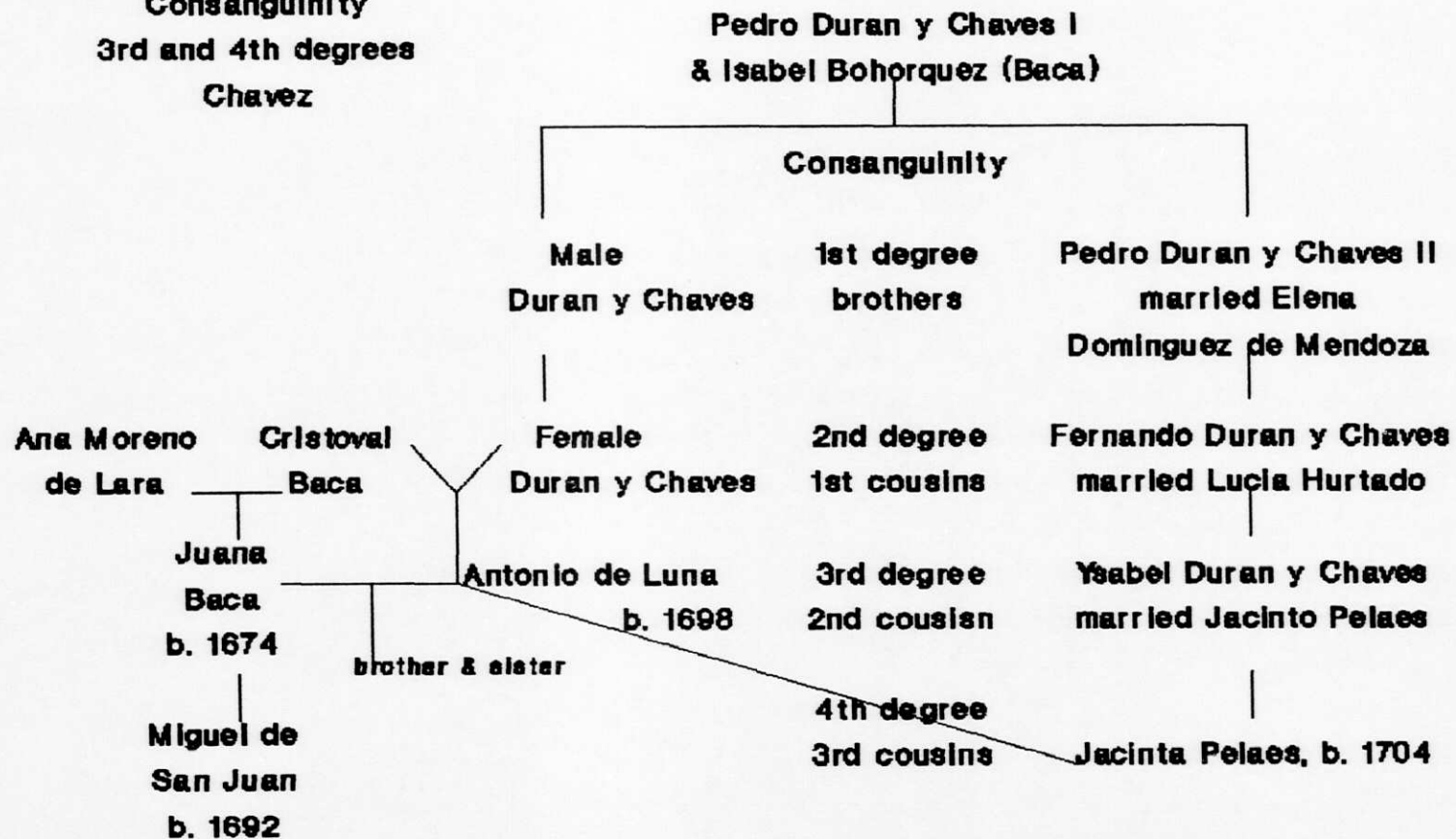

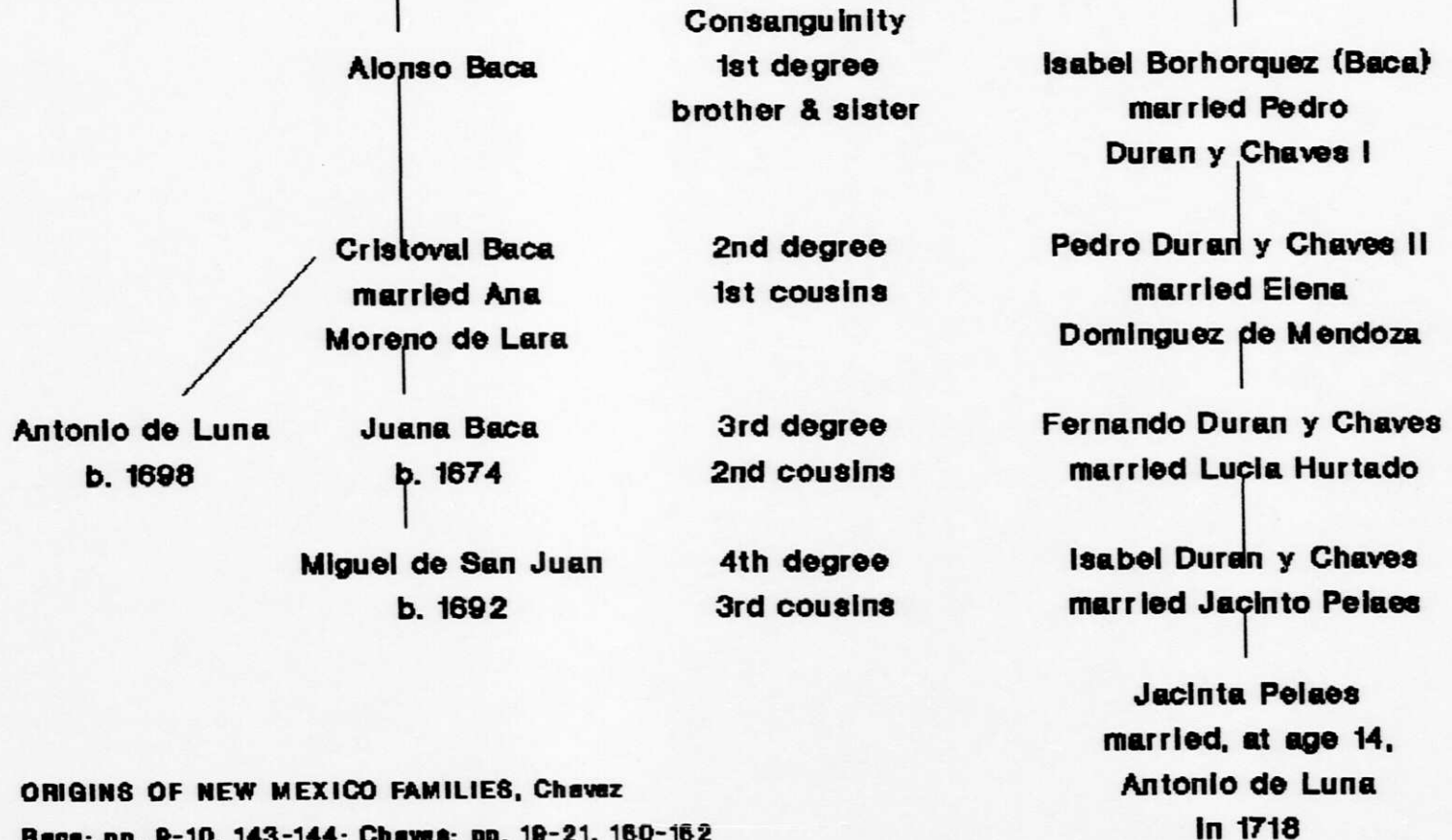

In ancient records, "brother" could mean a brother-in-law, but none of Juana Baca's sisters had married Antonio de Luna. If Antonio de Luna had been a whole brother, he would be a Baca. If he were a child of Juana Baca's mother, only, he would have been a Moreno de Lara, or a Trujillo, which was her actual name. It would seem Juana's father, Cristoval Baca is the father of Antonio de Luna. One would first imagine the mother of Antonio de Luna was a Luna woman.

In the 1692 Census of Guadalupe del Paso, we find in Ysleta (del Paso), in the same location as Ana Moreno de Lara:

"Capt. Diego de Luna, married to Elvira Garcia, two sons: Antonio 15 and Nicolas 5, a daughter Gregoria 24, and in his house, his mother, Maria Jaramillo.

Servants: Juan 40, Juan Antonio 10, and six other servants: Francisco 30, Juan 4, Thomasa 30, Maria 10, Juana 5, Josefa 1.

Capt Luna will gladly resettle in New Mexico, but April is too soon. If the King helps him, he will go alone, build a house and later bring his family."

There is a Bartolome de Luna, age 18, from Mexico among those sent to fill the ranks of the Vargas expedition, and this group were not the old, returning settlers. There is no further record of this man. (Spanish Archives II, #54c)

However, when Antonio de Luna and Jacinta Pelaez were graphed with their known ancestors, it evolved that Antonio de Luna's mother was a Chaves, the only mutual line leading to a common great grandfather. The name Luna is still a mystery.

Antonio de Luna was born in 1698. Cristoval Baca died 11 April 1697. He was "a Spaniard of New Mexico; his wife was Ana Moreno de Lara, living in El Paso." The death was recorded in Parral burials, Church of San Diego de las Minas Nuevas (now Escobedo, north of Parral). (Courtesy of Mr. Gerald Mandell of Albuquerque.)

The other Luna puzzle also remains. Miguel de San Juan, son of Juana Baca, had several children who used the name Luna, Muniz de Luna, Alvarez de Luna. Some used San Juan and Montoya for their mother, Isabel Montoya. There would seem to be a strong tie to a Luna family. Miguel de San Juan never used the name Baca, as did Juana Baca's daughters. Perhaps Bernabe Baca was their brother.

The stage is set with Capt. Manuel Baca in Real de San Lorenzo in the 1692 Census of Guadalupe del Paso and in Santa Fe in a Census of 1697. His mother, Ana Moreno de Lara, was in Ysleta (del Paso) in 1692 with Capt. Diego de Luna and his family. Juana Baca, 18, and her sister, Luisa Baca, 17, are in their father, Capt. Cristoval Baca's house in Pasaxe in 1692. Miguel de San Juan was born in 1692.

Capt. Cristoval Baca probably was serving at the Presidio of Nuestra Senora de la Limpia Concepcion del Pasaxe, Nueva Viscaya, now in the state of Durango, Mexico. (Courtesy of Mr. Gerald Mandell.)

JOSEFA BACA AND JUAN ANTONIO GARCIA

The Josefa Baca who purchased land from Ysabel Montoya is called the widow of Juan Antonio Garcia. Fray Chavez in ORIGINS OF NEW MEXICO FAMILIES, p. 141, states that Josefa Baca never married.

JUANA BACA, DAUGHTER OF JOSE BACA

In ORIGINS OF NEW MEXICO FAMILIES, Fray Angelico Chaves discusses Juana Baca on page 141. Juana was a niece of Ignacio Baca and an orphan of Jose Baca, who was murdered at Guadalupe del Paso. In 1693 Juana Baca returned to New Mexico with her mother, Josefa Pacheco, whose brother, Silvestre had murdered Jose Baca. Juana Baca later married Nicolas Ortiz II. On p. 249 we are told that Juana Baca had an illegitimate daughter, Ana Maria Baca, before she married Nicolas Ortiz II on 12 November 1702 and that Juana and Nicolas were "padrinos" for Apache baptisms in Bernalillo in 1705.

A very interesting document is in the SPANISH ARCHIVES OF NEW MEXICO, Vol. I, No. 964, in the English translations at the New Mexico State Archives. One Jose Antonio de la Fuente of Santa Fe sued to recover more of his mother's estate. His mother is Ana Maria Baca, daughter of Juana Baca. The suit took place on 27 July 1743 in Santa Fe and states that Ana Maria Baca was married for a year and a half to soldier, Jose Griego of Santa Fe, who died. The couple had a daughter, Petrona, before they married, and this child died young. Fuente was conceived and born to Ana Maria after Griego's death and is a grandson of Juana Baca who is married to Nicolas Ortiz II. Fuente has no descendants.

Dona Juana Baca lists and describes her daughter's pitiful estate. It contains only clothing and effects she used in the "14 years she lived." Of note were a brown petticoat with gold lace and two religious relics. Fray Chavez writes on p. 249 of ORIGINS OF NEW MEXICO FAMILIES that Ana Maria Baca died at age 26 on 27 June 1729, as recorded in the Santa Fe burial records.

Juana Baca states that Ana Maria was three years old when Juana married Nicolas Ortiz in 1702. Juana Baca states that she gave dowers only to her legitimate heirs by Ortiz and that she raised Jose de la Fuente. Fuente says he has a piece of property from Juana Baca and Nicolas Ortiz but that he worked for his upkeep until marrying four years earlier. Juana Baca replied that she could give no more to Fuente as what he received was taken from the inheritance of the Ortiz heirs. Further, Ana Maria left no bequests as she was unconscious throughout her illness until her death.

Another document in the SPANISH ARCHIVES OF NEW MEXICO, Vol. I, No. 181, and in the English translation, tells of the sale of a house near the church in Santa Fe built by one Juan Baca and his sons. Dona Juana Baca, widow of Capt Nicolas Ortiz, and two sons, Francisco and Antonio Ortiz, in

1746, sold the house at Royal sale to Sergeant-Major Don Joachin Codallos y Babal. The house was very close to the church cemetery and had a "main door to the street that goes to the parish church."

In NEW MEXICO ROOTS, LTD., by Fray Angelico Chavez, Vol. I, p. 155, we find the marriage investigation (D.M., or Diligencias Matrimoniales) of Josefa Pacheco and Jose Baca, the parents of Juana Baca.

16 August 1684, #1, Real de San Lorenzo
(Near Guadalupe del Paso.)

Jose Baca (18), native of New Mexico, son of Capt. Cristoval Baca and Dona Ana Moreno de Lara, natives of New Mexico, living in San Lorenzo, and Josefa Perez Pacheco (16), native of Santa Fe, daughter of Juan Perez Pacheco and Antonia de Arratia. Testigos (Witnesses): Antonia Sisneros (23), Francisco Gonzales (33), Sebastian Gonzales (40), Blas Griego (35), Luis Duran (30), Francisco Lopez (45), all of San Lorenzo.

The last three knew the bride since her birth. The pair married on 19 November 1684 with Capt. Francisco Xavier and his wife Dona Francisca Baca as witnesses.

SPANISH ARCHIVES OF NEW MEXICO by R. E. Twitchell, Vol. II, p. 76, #45: El Paso del Norte, 3 July 1687 to 9 Sept. 1690. Sylvestre Pacheco, soldier of the Presidio of San Felipe y Santiago, Janos. Trial for killing Jose Baca. Writs, petitions, testimony, dismissal, acquittal. Names many testifying. See also ORIGINS OF NEW MEXICO FAMILIES by Fray Angelico Chavez, p. 252, for parents of Sylvestre Pacheco and his sister Josefa. Josefa alive in tally of 1707-1708 with second husband Juan Tafoya.

ORIGINS OF NEW MEXICO FAMILIES by Fray Angelico Chavez, p. 291. Juan Tafoya Altamirano of Real Talpujagua married Josefa Pacheco, widow of Jose Baca. Josefa died before 1701(?) when Tafoya was charged with stealing oxen and defrauding his step-daughter, the wife of Nicolas Ortiz II.

SPANISH ARCHIVES OF NEW MEXICO by R. E. Twitchell, Vol. II, p. 142, #134b, 3 October 1707, Juan Tafoya. Suit against him by Alferez Nicolas Ortiz, relative to the taking away of an Indian captive.

NEW MEXICO ROOTS, LTD., by Fray Angelico Chavez, Vol. X, p. 1857, 6 March 1708, #3, Santa Fe: Juan Tafoya Altamirano, native of El Real del Talpujagua, widowed of Josefa Pacheco, . . . petitions to marry Maria, daughter of Fernando Duran y Chaves and Lucia Hurtado. Clara de Chaves, publicly known as bastard of Fernando Duran y Chaves, stated groom had had relations with her. Groom denies charge. Outcome not stated.
